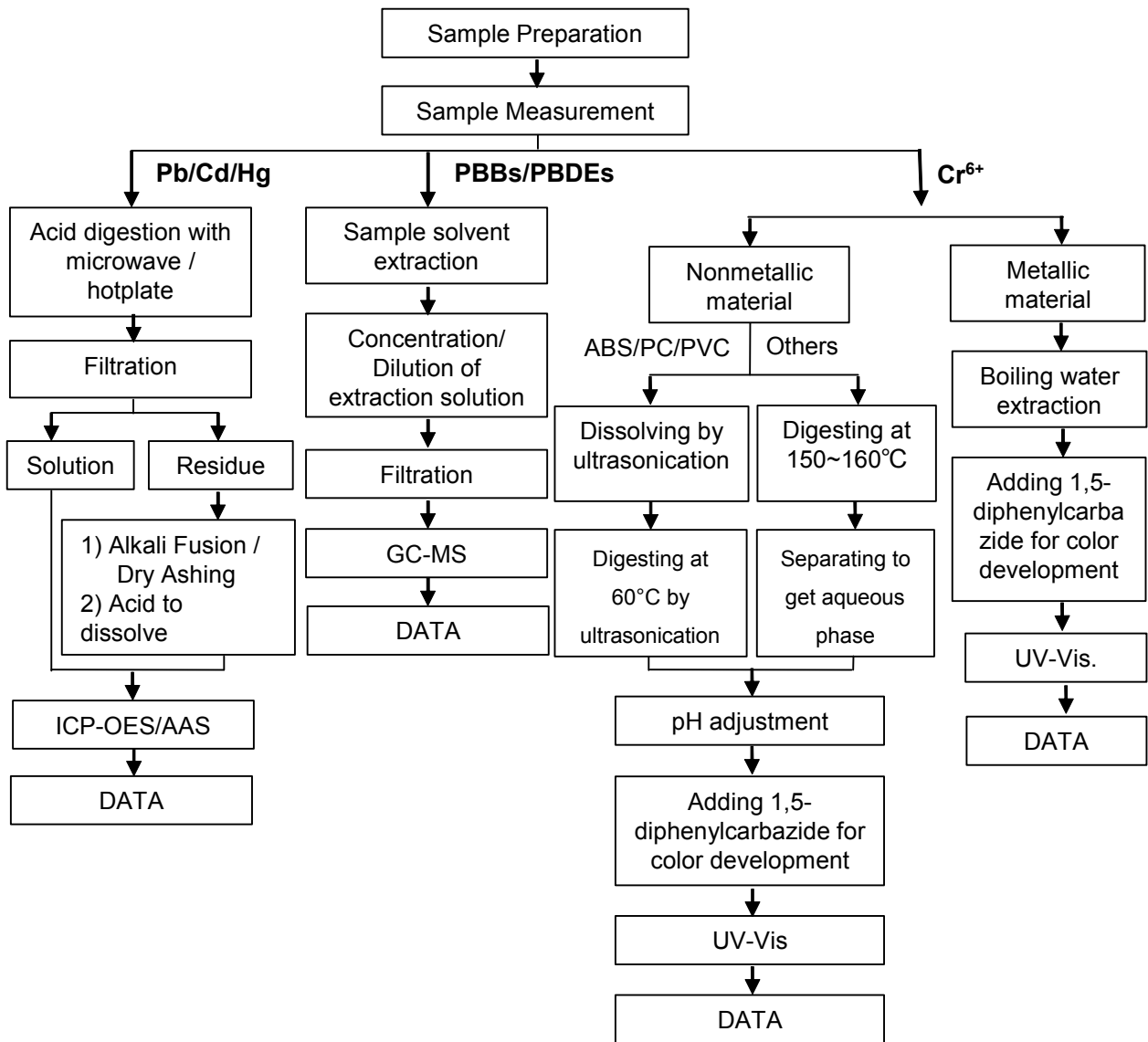
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**Pb/Cd/Hg/Cr<sup>6+</sup>/PBBs/PBDEs Testing Flow Chart**

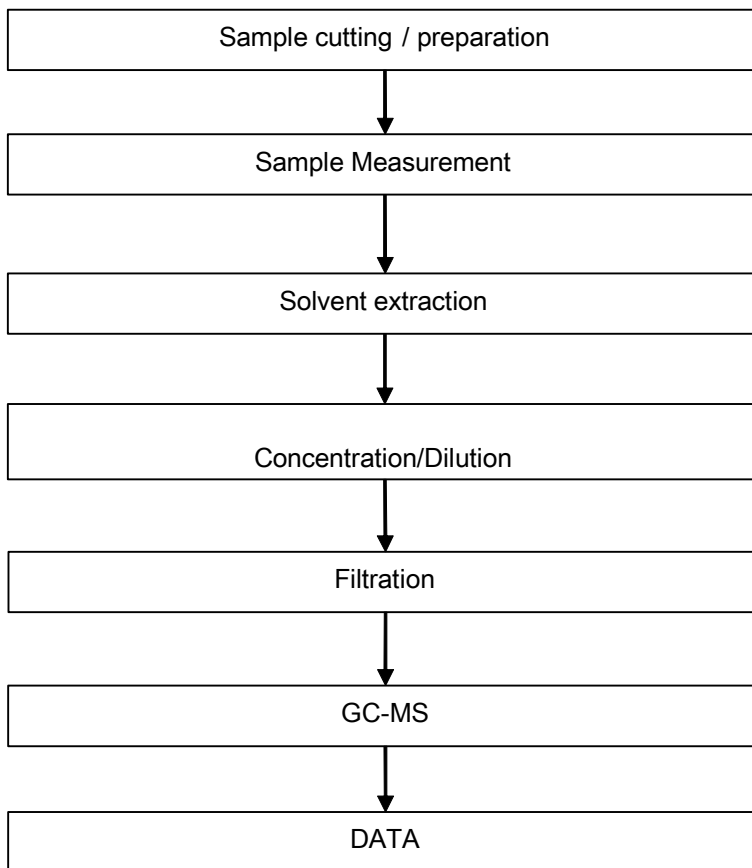


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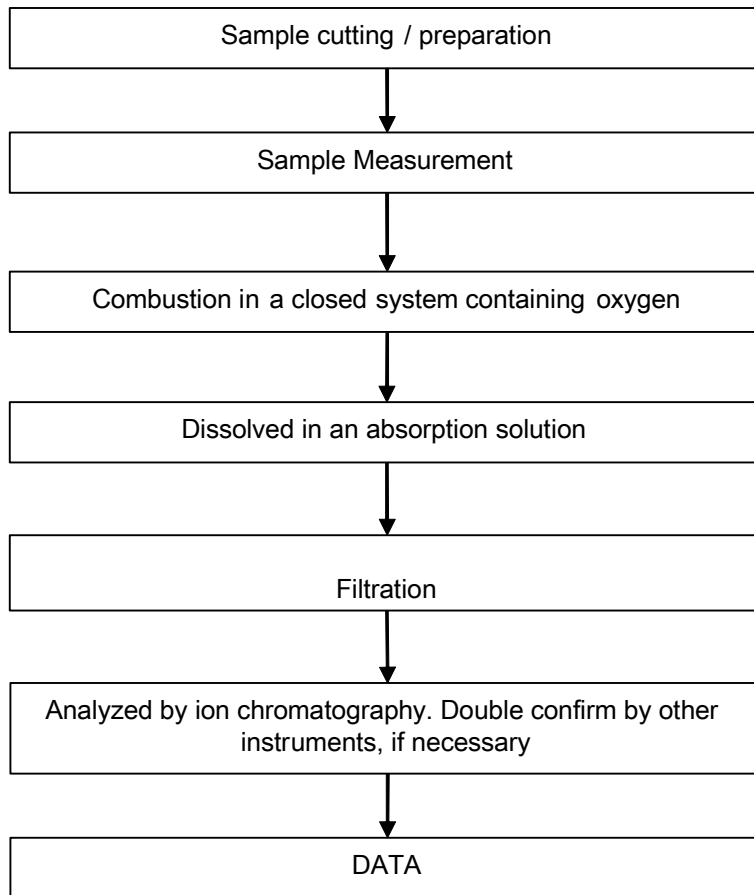
### Phthalates Testing Flow Chart





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Halogen Testing Flow Chart

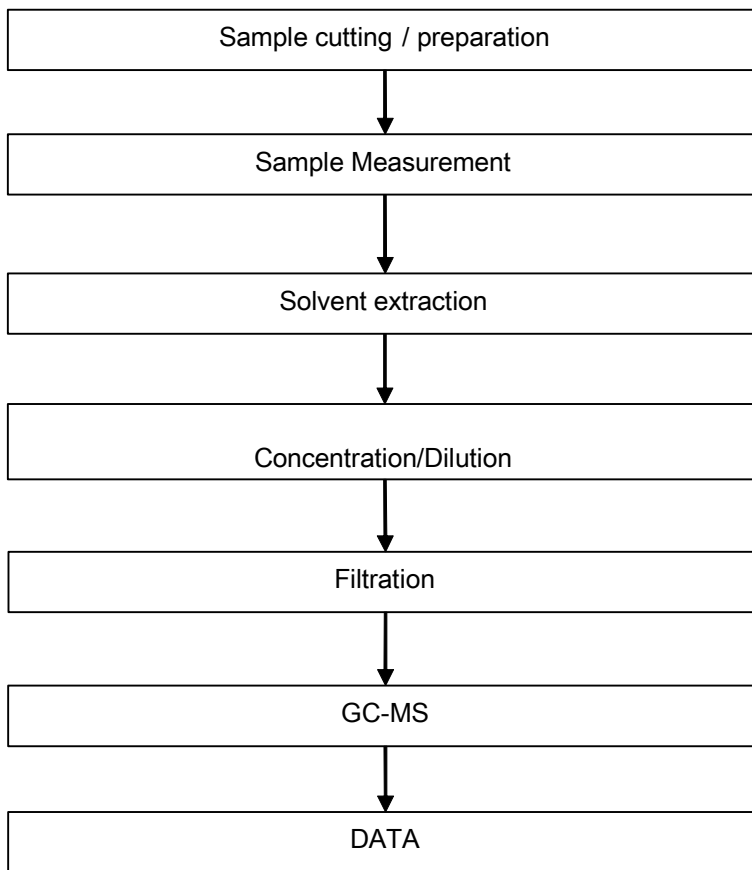


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### PAHs Testing Flow Chart

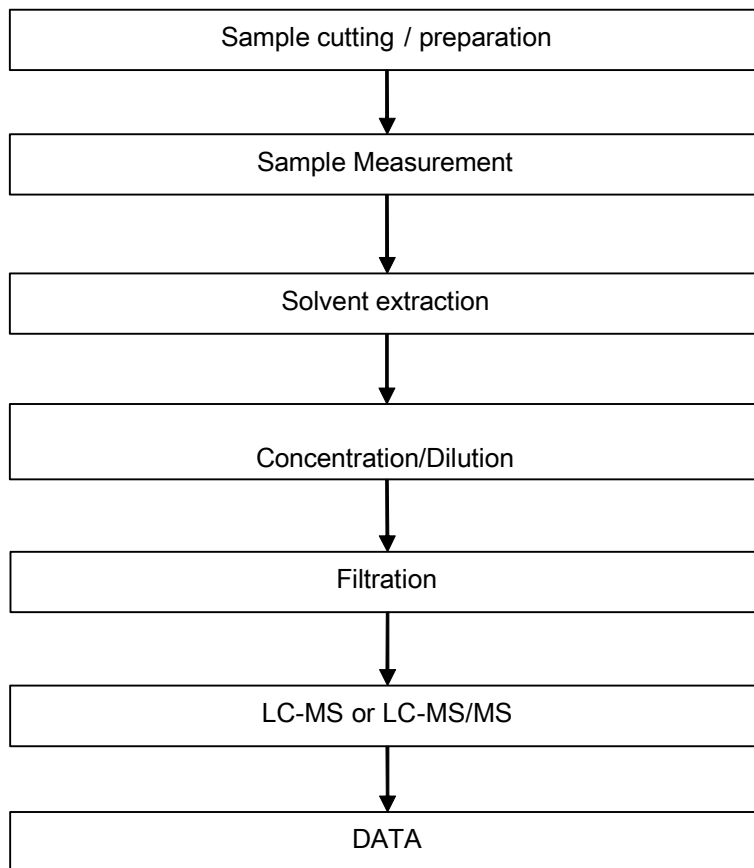


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### PFOA / PFOS Testing Flow Chart

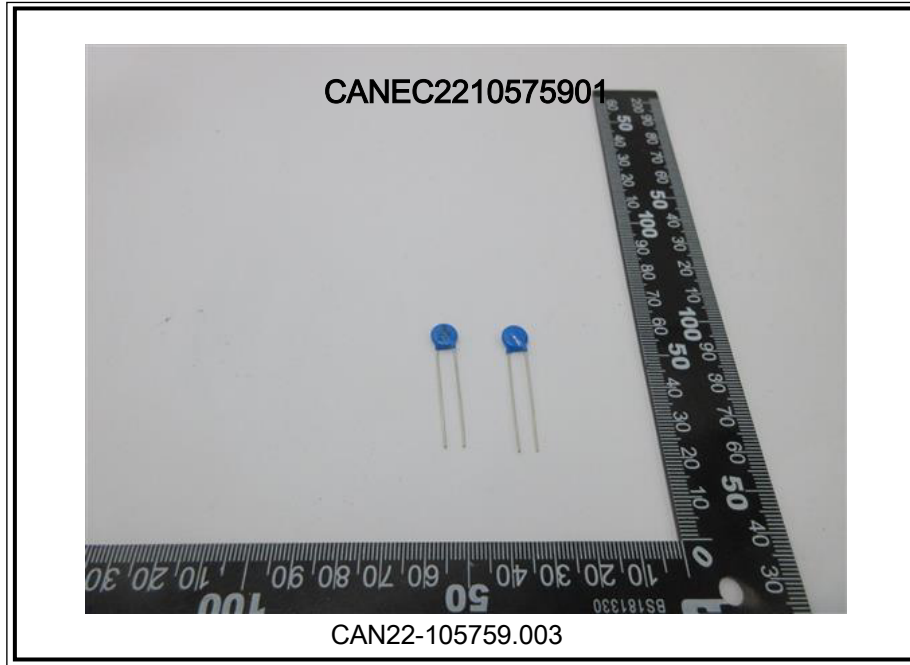


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
